[4 cr., 2, 4 cl.] Endodontic microbiology and emergencies. Evaluation of success and failure. Procedural accidents. Orthograde retreatment. Bleaching discolored teeth (internal, external). Endodontic surgery and adjuncts. Periodontal-endodontic considerations. Longitudinal tooth fractures. Differential diagnosis of orofacial pain. Geriatric endodontics. Restoration of endodontically treated teeth; dental trauma; pain control and patient management; endodontic emergencies; endodontic mishaps; and alternate treatments.

Clinic: clinical experience in patient endodontic treatment (exterior and anterior teeth) the clinical course required to complete endodontic treatment of anterior, premolar, and molar teeth. In addition to nonsurgical treatment of several endodontic cases, the student assists with an endodontic surgery. Study of endodontic diagnosis, treatment planning, and therapy, including management of endodontic emergencies and surgical endodontics in comprehensive clinical dental practice
